Theology

Jesus is the truest example of prophet, priest and King:

- 1 - Prophets represent God to the People - John 1:14
- 2 - Priests represent the people to God - Hebrews 4:14-16
- 3 - Kings exercise authority over the people in place of God - Hebrews 1:3-4

- How did you respond to the five ways a minister and “the minister to” respond to each other?
Here is a brief recap:
 1. Keep the Fire Burning
 2. Keep the Aroma Pleasing
 3. Keep the Elements Safe
 4. Keep the Priests supplied
 5. Keep fellowship Pure
- Which one do you struggle to understand or apply the most? Why?

Going deeper

- Thinking about “Keep the fire burning”:
 - This is the antidote to hardness of heart and being lukewarm. It comes from God but it is our responsibility to keeping it burning? Remember that the priests were doing daily menial tasks to do this. What daily menial tasks do you struggle to make sacred? How can the group support you to see through the daily grind?
- Thinking about “Keep the Aroma Pleasing”
 - This is the antidote to pride.
 - Read Ephesians 5:1-2 - what daily activities can we be doing to keep ourselves from pride? How does that work in the context of Ephesians?
- Thinking about “keeping the Elements Safe”
 - What is the context to this idea and how can our personal lives reflect this?
- Thinking about “keeping the Priests supplied”
 - What Biblical principles were discussed on Sunday?
 - 1 Corinthians 9
 - Nehemiah 13:10–11
 - Galatians 6:6
 - 1 Timothy 5:17–18
 - What makes these principles distorted in today’s world?
- Thinking about “keeping fellowship Pure”
 - While most of the regulations in this passage are addressed to those who are responsible for leading God’s people, all of us have the same obligation to serve God with diligence
 - What obligations do you think are missing from this chapter(s) but can be found elsewhere in the Bible?
